

"Bonsai Mint"



Very easy to care

Plectranthus ernstii 'Bonsai Mint'

The plant was discovered in 1977, on the cliffs of the Oribi Gorge Nature Reserve in KwaZulu-Natal, South Africa, by Ernst and Erma van Jaarsveld. Today the plant is still quite unknown to most people.

The plant is half-succulent, its stems are rubbery and juicy, leaves are herbaceous with a "fresh mint scent", it can also get small white-lavender blue cone-shaped flowers. The flowering stretches over the summer.

It is a "natural bonsai" so you can make your own Bonsai art.

Watered as needed, summer max. once a week, winter every other week, but if it is placed cool it can last up to 3 weeks without watering. Place the plant in a bright spot, but not direct sun. Surrounding temperature from 10-35 C is fine.
